The Mayfair neighbourhood is a densely-populated area on the eastern edge of Osbo Village, surrounded by Donald Street, Stradbrook Avenue, Main Street and the river. I one of the lowest-income neighbourhoods in the city and is home to a community w diverse range of cultural backgrounds and language:

You may remember the "shack" (as the former skate change building was known) j north of Donald that had served to the best of its ability as a very small and inadequ community space. Even with such limited space, people made the best of it, offer activities and supports for the programming needs of the Mayfair neighbourhood. The 1,500-square-foot "shack" was demolished in the summer of 2013 to make way for new building.

The city and province are jointly funding this community improvement project as pathe second phase of the Building Communities Initiative II program among other functions.

The Mayfair Recreation Centre will be a welcoming hub of activity, providing daintergenerational activities and programing for all ages, preschool to seniors. The magnetic programmable space will accommodate a variety of programs from active games educational seminars, and will continue to house the biweekly Harvest program in Mayfair community

It has been a challenge in this area to support recreational and social activities neighbourhood residents of all ages without a proper facility in place. This recreatentre should help address this need by providing a welcome and excellent resource the community.
